



Christus Victor Lutheran Church Council Minutes November 4, 2024 Council Meetings are Open and Everyone Is Invited to Attend. The Executive Board met Sunday, November 3, 2024, to plan the agenda.

Unite in Christ, Grow in Faith, Serve in Love, and Share the Good News

Attendance: Pastor Ellen Krich, Michael Schumann, Kelly Ruby, Phil Biedronski via Zoom, Linda Meyer, Linda McMahon, David Murray, Sandy Petrovich, Helen Tennant, Andrea Zahirsky. Shelly Shrader attended as a visitor (not a voting member of council).

Call to Order at 7:01 p.m.

Shelly Shrader opened the meeting with a prayer.

Approval of Minutes

The October minutes were reviewed, motion to approve was made by Andrea Zahirsky and seconded by Helen Tennant, the motion was passed. A copy of the minutes will be published in the next *Oakleaf*.

Order of Saint Stephen's Deacons - will worship at Epiphany on St. Stephen's Feast Day, December 26, 2024.

Investment Report and the Asset Account

Phil Biedronski prepared an Asset Report for the Council and a copy was distributed to the council. The investment account balance on October 31st was \$530,162.00, which is a decrease of approximately \$8000.00. Overall, 2024 has been a good year; the investment account is reduced year to date by approximately \$13,000.00 reflecting both investment gains and withdrawals.

Status of Funds – Helen Tennant

The October 2024 Profit and Loss Report indicated a shortfall of \$3171.24. The year-to-date report reflects income of \$254.376.00, expenses of \$235,324.00 and net income of \$19,051.89.

Old Business

Pastor's Report

The report outlined a list of the Pastor's suggested action items and items of interest.

Visitations – are ongoing

Bible Study - Is ongoing and powerful

Men's Group - Pray for success

Pub Theology - is ongoing and very successful

Office Computer – The counters need a new computer

Picture Wall – Ellen would like to have her picture on the Pastor wall; Linda McMahon and Pastor will work together to make that happen.

Ring at office door – Lee Krich has installed a Ring device on the office door. It will alert Sharon, Pastor Ellen and Andrea's phones.

Christmas Flyers – the flyer promises a small gift for each person who brings the flyer into the Church. David Murray advises that anyone who brings the flyer to Angelino's Restaurant will receive a discount. The council proposes both promotions; the discounts and the gift will be provided. Motion made by Linda McMahon, seconded by Kelly Ruby, and approved.

Thanksgiving Eve - Holden Evening Prayer – Several people from the Chosen project have volunteered to sing with the choir. Council advises Pastor to discuss this proposal with the Worship and Music Committee.

Big Tent Revival – Pastor Ellen Krich would like to have the Youth Group help with this Project. Sandy Petrovich expressed her concerns with taking the Youth Group into Baltimore City. This project was scrapped.

Hunger Task Force – The collection that was approved in an earlier Council Meeting will be scheduled for 11/10 during the Veterans Day Service.

Old Business

Budget 2025 – Social Ministry will now include FFF and Fellowship. Budgets will be combined into one line item. In response to the large increase in the BGE energy rates, the Property Team will schedule an Energy Audit from BGE. Hopefully they will be able to propose strategies that will save money in 2025. A decision was made that we will not be investing in the Concordia project in 2025. Motion to approve the budget was made by Andrea Zahirsky, seconded by Mike Schumann, and it was approved. The budget will be mailed to the Congregation and discussed at the Town Hall Meeting on 11/24.

Congregation members who wish to attend the Council Meetings – It was proposed that the members should contact Linda Meyer and request that their concerns and issues be added to the Council Agenda.

New Business

Commitment Cards – Temple Talks and Commitment cards will be moved to January 2025, after the Stewardship Committee Team Leader is assigned. Kelly Ruby made a motion to approve this change of schedule, David Murray seconded it, and the motion was approved.

Workshop to review Bylaws and prepare Action Plan for committees in 2025 – Sandy Petrovich proposes that we hold a council workshop to create an action plan for the Council in 2025.

Team Fair - it was proposed to hold a Team Fair at the first Sunday Social in February to recruit team members.

Nomination of potential New Council Members - The Vice President is tasked with recruiting potential new Council Members. Before nominations the responsibilities of council members will be communicated to potential new members.

Adjournment

Motion to adjourn was made by Sandy Petrovich and seconded by Andrea Zahirsky. Motion was carried and the meeting was adjourned; it ended with the Lord's Prayer.
