

Manifestus

The other day I woke up with an ear worm—no, not an earache. An ear worm is a tune that keeps replaying in one's mind and will not let go.

As it was repeating, I was able to remember three words only of the hymn that we sang in church the previous Sunday. "Manifested by the..." was all that came to mind. I tried to locate it in my copy of the *ELW* but, because that phrase is not the first line, the index of first lines provided no assistance.

Next, I tried the internet and discovered that Carl P. Daw, Jr. had written the hymn "Sing of God Made Manifest" in 1990. It did contain the word *manifest*, but it was not the one we had sung in our worship service. I did remember that the tune name was SALZBURG composed by Jakob Hintze in 1678.

Reopening the *ELW*, this time checking the index of tune names, I discovered that SALZBURG accompanied two hymn texts, one of which (number 310) is "Songs of Thankfulness and Praise." Happily, I found the hymn again.

I wondered about the significance of the use of the word *manifest* eight times in the four verses printed in the *ELW*. Checking its derivation, I learned that it came from the Latin word *Manifestus* meaning "caught in the act." Was I going off on a tangent here, or could it be that Jesus was caught in the act, and if so, what act? A more modern definition of *manifest* is "to make plain." Did Jesus make anything plain and if so, what?

Christopher Wordsworth, who wrote the hymn text for the sixth Sunday after Epiphany, said that his intention was to recall all the manifestations of Jesus, celebrated in the four Sundays prior. So yes, Jesus was "caught in the act" (clearly seen) by his Star and was the long-foretold branch of David's stem. Jesus was also caught in the act of changing water into wine at Cana and in his defeating the devil's might.

To me there is even more to this hymn. The hymn tune SALZBURG contains the clue. Although it was not written to accompany Christopher Wordsworth's text, the two are joined perfectly. Plotting the melodic line of phrase one, I discovered that the first four notes change direction three times. This motion is a *chiasmus*^[i] and is a symbol of the Cross, as alluded to in verse three.

Reviewing this hymn allowed me to remember Jesus' acts, things that the writer of John's Gospel calls *signs*. Of course, these acts serve to help us understand who the Word made flesh was (as Wordsworth says, "God in flesh made manifest"). Waking me up the other morning with that snippet of text along with a recurring melody is yet another example of how worship music affects my life.

¹¹ Chiasmi are found frequently in the Psalms and notably in J.S. Bach's music. His surname is also a chiasmus, and, given that he wrote his name musically into many of his scores, we become aware that the Cross was central to his Christology.

Christus Victor Lutheran Church Council Minutes

December 9, 2024

Council Meetings are Open and Everyone Is Invited to Attend. The Executive Board met Sunday, December 8, to plan the agenda.

Unite in Christ, Grow in Faith, Serve in Love, and Share the Good News

Attendance: Pastor Ellen Krich, Howard Stansbury, Michael Schumann, Kelly Ruby (via Zoom), Phil Biedronski (via Zoom), Linda Meyer, Linda McMahon, Sandy Petrovich, Helen Tennant, Andrea Zahirsky. Also Joel McCrea, Karen Biedronski and Ugonnaya Obineme (new 2025 council members)

Call to Order at 7:00 pm

Pastor Krich opened the meeting with a prayer.

Taylor Armstrong – Director of Music – addressed the council to announce that he is being deployed by the Air Force to active duty for six months beginning in April 2025. The council expressed their support for him and his family.

Approval of Minutes

The October minutes were reviewed, motion to approve with corrections was made by Andrea Zahirsky and seconded by Sandy Petrovich, the motion was passed. A copy of the minutes will be published in the next *Oakleaf*.

Investment Report and the Asset Account

Phil Biedronski prepared an Asset Report for the Council and a copy was distributed to the council. There was not a lot of activity in November. There was an increase of \$3,000.00. Year to date the Investment Account is down only \$10,000.00 despite withdrawals of \$60,000.00.

Status of Funds - Helen Tennant

The October 2024 Profit and Loss report indicated a shortfall of \$4,000.00. The year-to-date report reflects gain in net income of \$13,754.00, keeping in mind \$60,000.00 did come out of the Investment Account to offset income shortfalls in 2024. The Land Easement check for \$3,240.00 has been received and deposited to the Savings Account. Helen Tennant will be meeting with the bank to investigate alternative accounts that may pay more interest on our savings. Helen plans on moving to the new version of the QuickBooks software; this version operates online. Evans Funeral home paid \$1,000.00 for use of the hall and use of the church. They also indicated that they would like to return next year. Sandy Petrovich requested updates for committee budgets for the end of 2024. Helen will run those reports for her accounts.

Old Business

Pastor's Report

The report outlined a list of the Pastor's suggested action items and items of interest.

Donation of Poinsettias – Frank Rose donated 75 poinsettias, and they are being distributed to congregation members and shut ins. Our Visitation Team is taking them on their visits to the sick and elderly.

Response to Mailer - As of yet there has been no response to the mailers but a family that attended the Trunk or Treat event has expressed interest in attending our church.

Train Garden – The train garden has been generating a lot of interest and we need to publicize it more.

Advent Services – the services are well attended.

Blue Christmas Service – Emily Krich, Ugonnaya Obineme and Tate Armstrong have solos in the service.

Cookies and Cocoa Social – for the Christmas Eve services after the 4 pm service and before the 9 pm service.

Bob Hayman's Photos of the Church – Bob is donating a large photo of the inside of the church and Pastor Don has offered to frame it. Please think about where we should display it.

MLK JR Community Service Team – The MLK team has offered to perform a service project for our church before the end of 2024. Howard Stansbury offered to coordinate this project and suggested Pastor Ellen give the team his cell phone number.

Visitor Contact at Sunday Service – Pastor Ellen suggested perhaps the Narthex needs to be re-designed to facilitate better communication with visitors. The council discussed this issue and determined that this is the responsibility of the ushers and should be addressed with them during training. Karen Biedronski indicated that we need more prayer cards in the Narthex.

Secret Pal Project – Helen Tennant reminded us that the final gift in this project will be given at the Christmas Party on 12/15. The name of the receiver of the gift should be on the outside of the card and it should be signed on the inside of the card by the giver. She also asked for a vote of those who would like to continue the project next year. This was project was agreed upon for 2025.

Holiday Party – Kelly Ruby confirmed that she expects about 25 people for the party and she needs donations of food items. Everyone who is coming should respond to her email.

Hall Usage Form – Andrea Zahirsky has drafted a new form for 2025 which includes an increase of the cost from \$250.00 to \$300.00 for non-parishioners and will include a non-refundable deposit of \$50.00 in the case of cancellation. If the event goes forward as planned the \$50.00 will be credited to the total cost. Michael Schumann made a motion to accept the changes and Helen Tennant seconded the motion. The motion passed.

New Business

The Executive Committee – The President - Linda Meyer (incumbent), Vice President - Andrea Zahirsky (incumbent) and Karen Biedronski - Secretary were proposed as the members of the 2025 Executive Committee. Helen Tennant is an appointed member and Pastor Ellen is a member per the church Bylaws. Helen Tennant made a motion to approve these council members as the Executive Committee, Howard Stansbury seconded the motion and it was approved.

Team Leader Selections for 2025 – Helen Tennant passed out a form to each 2025 council member asking them to indicate their preference for the team they would like to lead (1st, 2nd and 3rd choices). The forms were marked and passed to Linda Meyer.

Team Fair – The Fair is scheduled for 2/2/25. Whichever team is scheduled to provide food for the First Sunday Social for that day should provide finger food so everyone can walk around to each table.

Church Keys and Door Codes - Everyone on the Church Council receives keys and door codes. Anyone leaving the Council will be requested to return the keys. Reminders were made regarding the policy of not sharing the codes. If other congregation members have roles that require keys, they may be assigned keys and codes by the council. The council members should not share the keys and codes with team members, they are required to be at the meetings to allow entrance to the building. Michael Schumann has the master code book and the master code to change the lock codes. Michael Schumann and Howard Stansbury will look into the logistics of changing the codes and report their findings in January.

First Sunday Socials – The January Social will be sponsored by the Church Council. A schedule will be distributed at the January Council Meeting listing which team will organize and provide food for each Sunday Social event. The church will provide paper products. The Sunday Social is a friendly event, not a competition among the teams.

Evening Groups for Hall Use - Andrea Zahirsky has received a request from a self-help group regarding using the hall every Thursday. Sandy Petrovich and Ugonnaya Obineme both feel the hall is booked up too many evenings and Congregational projects, the youth group, team meetings and events do not have enough available times to hold their events. Sandy also brought up the issues regarding the Cub Scouts: the areas that they use are not always left in good order. Andrea will contact the troop leaders and remind them to clean up after the meetings. Andrea Zahirsky made a motion to approve the request; Helen Tennant seconded the motion. The motion did not pass.

Adjournment

Motion to adjourn was made by Andrea Zahirsky and seconded by Michael Schumann. Motion was carried and the meeting was adjourned at 8:38 PM and it ended with the Lord's Prayer.
